### **MISSION**

NCAA was founded in 1968 as a non-profit organization whose purpose is to:

- ❑ Encourage and aid artists to produce original works of art of every type and character, including but not limited to painting, sculpture, ceramics, woodcraft, drawing, and meal crafts.
- ❑ Furnish the auspices for the display of such works in Coweta County and elsewhere
- ❑ Foster education and instruction in the creation and appreciation of works of art.

The NCAA supports the arts in Coweta County Schools through annual donations to middle and high school art programs. Up to three scholarships are awarded each year to high school students pursuing the arts in college.

NCAA also provides painted Memory Boxes to local hospitals for use in their pediatric and maternity units, and donates and paints windows for Habitat for Humanity's annual Fund Raiser Auction.

## **EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES**

## **ART SHOWS**

**Spring Art Show:** A one-day show held around the Newnan Court-house Square in April of each year. Exhibitors pay a nominal entry fee and are provided a 10' x 10' space. Display panels are available on request. Exhibitors are responsible for their space. Ribbons and cash prizes are awarded.

**Christmas Market:** A three-day show held in November at the Coweta County Fair Grounds. An entry fee is required. Exhibitors work some portion of the three-day show. Refreshments are served throughout the show. NCAA provides drinks and serving products, members provide the finger food.

**Centre for Performing and Visual Arts Exhibit:** A prestigious, juried show held the month of June each year. Entry fee required. Ribbons and cash prizes are awarded. A *formal* reception is held in conjunction with the awards presentation. NCAA hosts the reception.

## **PAINT-IN AT ART HOUSE**

An informal weekly event held each Tuesday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. NCAA members (and their guests) bring work and visit with each other as they paint. It is a fun time and a good way to get to know other members as well as an opportunity to discuss your work with other artists.

## **WORKSHOPS**

At least two workshops are scheduled each year. They are usually held at the Art House. The number of students participating determines fees for the workshop. Usually the fees are very reasonable.
