Quilts of Valor is a National Foundation formed in 2003 to honor veterans for their service and sacrifices. The Foundation as a whole has awarded **186,310** Quilts of Valor to deserving veterans since its inception. Coweta County Quilts of Valor is a local chapter of QOVF. Our group started making quilts in August 2014. As of today, we have awarded **359** Quilts of Valor to local veterans. The quilts are awarded to veterans with a brief presentation, often attended by the recipients family and friends.

Our group meets the **4th Saturday monthly** for our "Sew-cial", (except in May, when we meet the 3rd Saturday, due to Memorial Day weekend falling on the 4th Saturday), at the American Legion / VFW Hall in Newnan. We work on Quilts of Valor from 10 am - 3 pm. Volunteers bring their sewing machines and extension cords and enjoy working together. We welcome visitors to drop by to see what we do, and we welcome anyone interested in helping to create the quilts.

Visit our Facebook page a few days before each Sew-cial to be sure everything is still on schedule and that the location hasn't changed. Every once in a while, something unexpected comes up at the American Legion / VFW that requires us to change dates or location. **Facebook page - @CowetaQuiltsofValor**


There are usually about 35-40 veterans on the waiting list for quilts at all times.

Our group is one of the few that provides the fabric for the quilts so it doesn't cost our volunteers much more than their time to participate. The fabric is purchased with profits from our annual fish fry each year. This year's event will be Saturday, August 11th at Newnan First United Methodist Church, from 4-7 pm.

Our volunteers will tell you that they experience so much joy in making Quilts of Valor for our veterans. The recipients have said that they feel incredible joy in receiving them.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - APRIL 2018

A general meeting of the Newnan-Coweta Art Association ("NCAA"), was called to order by President Tammy Troyer at 7:31 pm, on Thursday, April 19, 2018, at the Harriet Alexander Art Center.

President Troyer extended a warm welcome to members, new members, and guests, and thanked members Cheryl Hipke and Kristi Westlake for providing refreshments.

The Door Prize drawing (for a beautiful pottery tray donated by Tammy Troyer) was won by Kristi Westlake.

Suzanne Kleese-Stamps, Secretary, reported that the minutes of March 2018 General Meeting were electronically filed and published in the April 2018 newsletter.

On behalf of Fred Buyarski (Treasurer), Cheryl Hipke reported NCAA account balances as follows:

Total account balances \$141,310.24. The Treasurer's report was approved and filed.

On behalf of Fred Buyarski (Membership Chairman), Cheryl Hipke reported a total of 151 members in good standing; 32 memberships expired, with 2 more due to expire in April.

Sponsorship — Nothing new to report. On behalf of Teresa Foshee, Tammy Troyer reminded members of the "Each One Get One" campaign and to submit sponsor leads to Teresa.

Website & Social Media — Suzanne Kleese-Stamps reported that the website Gallery listing is being updated in April and will artists whose memberships are expired beyond their 2-month grace period will come off the listing. She reminded members to update their memberships, as needed, by the end of April.

BUSINESS ITEMS:

"Newnan, A Storybook Town" Fiberglass Art Project —

President Troyer provided an update. The fiberglass roosters (that were on delayed delivery) will be delivered in 1-2 weeks; therefore, the deadline to complete, for these pieces only, has been extended until May 28. Deadline for delivery of all other completed pieces to the Powell Center is o/a May 21. Clear coating by Southtowne begins on 5/21 (a few at a time).

Art installation in downtown Newnan & City Park o/a May 28 from 3-5 pm. A reception and book signing will be held at Carnegie Library on June 3. We will keep participants advised of any updates to the current schedule.

Mural for CCS Burwell Program (Headstart) — Dayna Caldwell reported that the mural is in the final stages and estimate to complete is 2 weeks. There is no art program at Burwell. Tammy will contact Newnan Times-Herald to see if we can get some publicity.

13th Annual Member Juried Art Exhibit — Pam Trued gave a detailed update on the 2018 Juried Art show and Reception. She pointed out that growth and building confidence as an artist comes slowly, but it does come, especially when an artist is accepted into a show for artists of all levels and which attracts hundreds of visitors. - Entry fee is \$35 and covers up to 3 art pieces
- Notification letters will be sent out on May 23
- June 5 - Deliver art to Nixon Centre, 9:00 am
- Food for the Reception is being catered but not desserts. Discussion on members providing desserts or each donating \$5 to \$15 towards the cost of desserts resulted in members preferring to donate funds and not having to fuss with bringing food.
- Event postcards and posters were available for members to distribute to friends, neighbors, and the community.
- Reception attire: cocktail attire or Sunday wear
- Pam reminded members that the going "all out" for the Reception this year is only for this year due to it being the 50th anniversary of NCAA.

NCAA 2018 Scholarships — Denise Marsh reported that the judging had been completed. Winners are all from East Coweta High School (ECHS) and will be announced at the school's Honor Night on April 30. David Trued will prepare certificates; Cheryl Hipke will prepare formal award letters for each recipient. Denise Marsh will present the awards on April 30. The three winners will be invited to attend the May general meeting. The student entries this year were exceptional.

NCHS 3rd Annual Art & Architecture — Tammy Troyer reported on the May 5th Art & Architecture event on the Court Square, 10 am until 12 pm. This event coincides with Newnan's Market Day, so there will be a lot of people on the square. The A&A tour begins at the Court House, where Bette Schumann will be painting. Artists who have already signed up to paint should now have their assigned locations for painting. Kristi Westlake volunteered for one of the (still) open spots - thank you! There are a couple more openings. Margo Merrifield is the contact person for NCAA artists participating in this event.

City Hall Artist of the Month ~ May 2018

Ellie Farrington



As a child in Maine, Ellie was greatly influenced by the visiting Art Teacher at the one room school she attended and wanted to be able to create “real” paintings when she was older, but that was a long time in coming. Her artistic expression was limited to decorating her home and sewing clothing for the family and others, while at home caring for the family of five children.

When the youngest was in high school, Ellie took a position as secretary to the Superintendent of Schools, which she held for eight years. Then, after 60 years in Maine, Ellie and Bernie moved to Georgia in 1987 where they opened a Blimpie Restaurant and worked there for nine years, meeting a good many of Newnan’s families.

In 1988, she became aware of the oil painting lessons offered through the Recreation Department with Tom Powers and began to pursue her dream of learning to paint. She took lessons from Tom as long as they were available. She has taken workshops and continues to paint weekly with a group of local artists.

A member of the Newnan-Coweta Art Association (NCAA) and Southern Crescent Alliance of Visual Artists (SCAVA), she has exhibited in many of their shows, as well as at Coweta County Fair. She has won a number of merit award ribbons and had two of her paintings on display in the office of Mac Collins in Washington, D.C. for a year.

She works in her church and with the Alzheimer’s Association, while continuing to study, paint and serve in the art community. Her paintings have been described as “happy,” which is appropriate since they are a reflection of her happiness and her joy in painting and life in general. Her subjects include flowers (many of which she has grown in her gardens), scenes from the Maine coast, places she has visited and most anything that takes her fancy. She is well known for using vivid colors, and painting on large canvases. Her paintings grace many a home in this area and around the country.

Newnan-Coweta Library receives donation for art books

The Newnan-Coweta Public Library recently received a donation from NCAA towards the purchase of new children's art books for the library. The new art books, now on display at the library, offer children step-by-step instruction on "how to" do several types of artwork such as painting or drawing at home. Some of the books also tell about well-known artists. Over the years, NCAA has been contributing funds to the local library for children's books, educational materials, and other needed supplies. Many of the art books were purchased to be used as helpful references when the library offers children's craft workshops.

Woodturner Ken Hamilton to be featured at spring arts, crafts show

A historic Coweta County tree, felled in the yard of Sharpsburg Mayor Alvin Arrowwood last year, will take on a new life during the NCAA's Spring Arts & Crafts Show tomorrow on the Courthouse Square. The beauty of the 200-year old Sharpsburg Water Oak tree has been preserved and enhanced in a turned wood vessel by woodturning artist Ken Hamilton of Newnan. The old tree was more than 5' in diameter and was destined for firewood when, with the mayor's permission, Hamilton retrieved several cuttings to use for his wood turning art.

Ken has been turning wood since 1983. He uses woods of many species of trees, both green and dried, to fashion his one-of-a-kind vessels. Ken is a conservator who rescues wood scraps, tree cuttings, or trees felled for reasons other than for wood turning. Often friends alert him to available woods.
