They are as similar as they are different. Although they've been married for decades, and both retired from the military with IT backgrounds and have two masters each in the same fields, they have different approaches to creating art. It's like yin and yang; they complement each other and combine their talents to create something quite unique.

Roger grew up drawing and painting, and continued to create art throughout high school. Before leaving for the military, he passed on his knowledge to, and inspired, his younger brother, who is now a prominent artist in the Atlanta art scene and still has Roger's favorite comics. Roger put aside creative outlets while serving in the military. After leaving the service, he rekindled a creative spark that never went away and found his voice through photography. Having spent much time stationed in southeastern U.S., he has an affection for the south, its culture and pastoral landscapes. He enjoys discovering new places, and has literally and figuratively turned getting lost into an art. Although if you asked him, he would say, "I'm never lost, I'm simply exploring".

Charlene always considered herself a left-brained person, all numbers and logic. Underneath it all was a creative mind that just needed to find a medium to express itself. She applied for a university facility position to instruct web developers and was offered a photo editing course as well. It was the beginning of a lifelong love. As a Georgia girl, she has a deep love of life in the south. Her respect and fondness for rural landscapes is evident in her photography. Her passion for people is evident in her community activity. She has mentored other young women, and been President of the American Business Women Association (ABWA) and Fine Art and Crafts Entrepreneurs (FAACE), which inspired the creation of the Magnolia Arts Festival in Peachtree City.

"Photography is our life. There are many aspects to creating a final photograph. First, is the idea, then the research, preparation, capturing that vision in the camera, adding other creative elements, such as textures and color grading, and finally printing and framing. We each take a part in creating the final artwork, bringing our unique and very different perspectives to each piece."

## GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - OCTOBER 2017

A general meeting of the Newnan-Coweta Art Association ("NCAA") was called to order by President Barbara Omerod at 7:08 pm, on Thursday, October 19, 2017, at the Harriet Alexander Art Center.

President Omerod welcomed members, new members, and guests.

Door Prize drawing was for an art piece by demonstrator Martin Pate and was won by Beth Snipes.

President Omerod thanked members Teresa Foshee, Lila Oliphant, Bette Schumann, and Barbara Moore for providing refreshments.

Suzanne Kleese-Stamps, Secretary, reported that the minutes of September 2017 General Meeting were electronically filed and published in the October newsletter.

Fred Buyarski, Treasurer, reported NCAA account balances as follows:

Value Checking (PP/FB Trx)	\$	756.88;
Value Checking	\$	5,051.83;
Business Savings	\$	5.52; and
Money Market	\$	141,495.55.

Total account balances \$147,309.78. The Treasurer's report was approved and filed.

Jenny Jones presented NCAA Treasurer with a check for \$500 (proceeds from the 2nd Annual Labor Day Arts Festival). The funds will be designated for the Scholarship Fund.

Membership Chairman, Fred Buyarski, reported a total of 195 members on the roster; of those, 11 memberships are expired for a total of 184 members in good standing.

Website & Social Media — Suzanne Kleese-Stamps encouraged members to add gallery page registration to their membership renewals so the community can connect with them to view their work and contact them, as desired. She also stated that if members have art classes to publish, please notify us at email: [newnancowetaartassociation@gmail.com](mailto:newnancowetaartassociation@gmail.com) with details. A new "Classes" page will be added to the website.

### BUSINESS ITEMS:

The Budget Committee — Fred Buyarski, Jenny Jones, Barbara Omerod, and Tammy Troyer will meet on November 17 at 10:30 am at Corner Arts Gallery to prepare a proposed budget for 2018.

West Georgia Technical College (WGTC) — "Finding Art in Everything" photography exhibit featuring Teresa Foshee opened on October 3rd and runs through October 27th. Teresa is coordinating the 2018 exhibits and asked artists to add their name to the sign-up sheet if they are interested in exhibiting at WGTC.

"Newnan, A Storybook Town" Fiberglass Art Project — Tammy Troyer, Barbara Omerod, and Bette Hickman introduced the newest art installation project and recognized storybook contest winners Susan Mayer-Davis (author) and Janet Burns (illustrator). Laura Mattia, Marketing Director at ChildrenConnect, introduced herself and spoke briefly about her role at ChildrenConnect and how the project will benefit the museum. She provided a large poster photo of one of the fiberglass animals (a sitting pig) so artists could get an idea of the fiberglass animals available for purchase by project sponsors. NCAA artists who would like to participate in the project, in collaboration with a project sponsor, were asked to add their names to a sign-up sheet. Sponsors will choose from four farmyard animal figures: a standing cow (\$3,500); a donkey/mule (\$3,000); a sitting pig (\$2,500); or a rooster on a rock (\$2,000). Deadline for sponsorship is December 2nd. Artists are encouraged to assist with obtaining sponsors. The committee's goal is to have 15-20 sponsors by mid November.

### VETERAN'S DAY

In light of the fact today is Veteran's Day, on the History channel there have been many reminders of the sacrifices men and women have made when our country has been at war. I did not date my husband until WWII was over, but in some cases, the effects of war continue long after the finish of war.

I expect today Bernie would have been told he had PTSD (I hope I have that right!). I don't know exactly how long he had been home from the war in Germany, but he had served in the 168th Combat Engineers in the European theatre participating in 5 major battles, including the Battle of the Bulge. His unit received commendations from both Belgium and France. We had planned to go to Bangor Fair in Maine when he called me to tell me he would be late.

It seems he had been outside his home with his mother when a plane went overhead. For a minute, he believed the war was on and he dove to the ground. When he realized the actual circumstances, it was upsetting. He felt so humbled to have made it home when so many of his friends and acquaintances had lost their lives. When his unit had reunions, he would not sit on a couch with any who had been taken prisoner of war.

Fortunately, he was able to have a very productive life ultimately becoming a well known salesman for Kraft Foods and a leader in his church. We married in 1943 and have 5 precious children...9 grand children...15 great grand children and more on the way, so God has blessed us mightily.





## Storybook Theme Chosen for 3rd Public Art Project

ChildrenConnect Children's Museum of Newnan is launching its third public art project – one that will tell its own story.

This will be the third project with area artists painting fiberglass figures. ChildrenConnect will pair artists with sponsors who will pay for one of the four types of animal figures that will be part of the display.

"Newnan: A Storybook Town" will be the theme for this art project.

The figures hearken back to Coweta's agricultural heritage. Sponsors may choose a cow, \$3,500; a mule, \$3,000; a pig, \$2,500; or a rooster, \$2,000. Artists will use their creativity in painting the figures, which will then be displayed around the downtown Newnan area and in city parks.

After the display period, sponsors can enjoy the art pieces at their home or business.

The deadline for sponsorship is Dec. 24. The fiberglass figures will be arriving in February or March. Artists will turn their pieces in by May 5, with a scheduled unveiling in early June.
