Celebrating 45 years of Young Artists

The Young Artists of Newnan & Coweta program was founded by Mrs. Bette Hickman ("Mrs. Bette") in 1979. Classes were first held at Bette's farm and then moved to what was lovingly referred to as "the old Art House" on the current property. Coweta County Parks & Recreation began sponsoring the youth art program at that time.

In 1999, Mrs. Teri Lewis ("Mrs. Teri") joined the program. Teri's daughter had been taking classes, and Teri was one of the mother's helpers. Teri did not have an art background, but she paid attention to what Bette was teaching and found that she was learning and creating, too! Bette recognized Teri's passion for art and growing skills remarking, "I think there's an artist in you!" Teri stuck with it (long after her daughter was no longer in the program) nurturing students and developing her own talent. The duo have been a great team ever since!

both art days. The pavilion at the Tommy Thompson Senior Center was used as an outdoor classroom. All CDC guidelines were followed! These students endured much adventure which included rainy days (as two major hurricanes passed through the area), tons of bug bites in spite of tons of bug spray, unrelenting winds, discovering the beauty of mushrooms growing among the flowers, and the loss of daylight as winter weather began to set in.

February 2021 ushered in online Zoom ART Classes. We met a few times in February and March at no charge to our students. In April and May, we offered a couple of Saturday workshops and in June held our first summer









From fall 2000 through spring 2002, classes were held at the Manget-Brannon Alliance for the Arts. In 2002, the "old Art House" was replaced with the current building, the Harriet Alexander Art Center (aka Art House). Classes began in the new building in Fall 2002.

The Coweta County Board of Commissioners recognized the Young Artists and Bette with a proclamation in March 2019.

In March 2020, all programs were suspended due to the pandemic. No classes were conducted from mid-March through August. In September, art classes resumed with a small fraction of the student body. Lily Goodson (former

camp in several years with a limited number of students. In addition, Coweta County broke ground on the "Outside Art Classroom" and pavilion on our current property. This project was completed in November 2021, and we held our first Saturday workshop in December.

April 2022 was celebrated as our End-of-Year Art show, and the Outside Art Classroom was dedicated at that time. There were over 100 in attendance as Director Jim Gay performed the dedication service. That September, our numbers increased, and we began a daytime class for homeschooled students on Wednesday mornings.

In January 2023, increased interest in younger students evolved into creating a new Tuesday afternoon class for ages 4-6. The April End-of-Year Art Show had over 300 in attendance, and refreshments were made available for purchase via food truck. May through July was celebrated with three different Art Camps. By September, our numbers once again increased, and we began offering a second homeschool class on Thursday mornings.

It is now 2024! January began (Spring Semester) with record enrollment!

Artist of the Month March 2024

Denise Marsh

The NCAA has selected **Denise Marsh** as its featured "Artist of the Month" for March 2024. Denise's art will be displayed in the entry way to Newnan City Hall until March 31st.

Denise grew up without art in the public schools she attended and was not exposed to art until she took a required art survey course at university. "It rocked my world!" she exclaimed. She declared her major to art education and never looked back. Denise loved talking about art and teaching her students the basics of art education.

Before retiring from teaching, she began taking studio classes in order to create, rather than simply demo for her students. She loves color and began with pastel and moved into acrylics and has now landed in creating with oils. She paints outside and in studio. As Denise began to paint, she wondered what would inspire her. As she

reviewed her work, the answer was clear: landscapes. "The play of light on even the simplest scene evokes such strong emotion; I want to capture it on my canvas."

Lately, her subject matter has become more diverse as well as returning to acrylics, watercolor and pastel. She enjoys florals and small canvases rather than much larger works. Mrs. Marsh enjoys painting whatever captures her interest at the moment.

After attending schools in DeKalb County, she moved to Coweta County in 1981 with her husband Tom and children. She returned to college in her late 30's to complete her degree.



While still teaching she began taking pastel classes at night in Newnan at a local art studio. She enjoys participating in workshops, as well.



3D Artist Tips & Strategies

Your Bio: Make a Personal Connection with the Viewer



Viewing handmade artwork or buying from an artist should be a different experience from buying in a store. Include a picture of yourself in your bio. It can be a "head shot", a photo of you working in your studio, or a photo of you with your art. Tell people what inspires you to do art. How does art enhance your life?

Place your bio at eye level in font that is large enough to read easily. I know you want to place

your best artwork in this prime location. You can still do that. Your bio can be off to one side. If your artwork is low, you can place it in front of your bio, as long as it doesn't block people from being able to read it.

The objective is to connect you to the artwork. The viewer has to be able to see your picture and read your information easily to make that connection.
